There is an NSF-funded travel award available for you to attend the 12th Rosaceae Genomics Conference in Costa Brava, Spain, May 6-9, 2025.

The award covers all costs (up to \$5,000) associated with traveling to and attending the conference, including an additional 1-week internship at the flagship research institutions and laboratories working on the genomics of

Rosaceae in Spain (May 12 - 17, 2025). It is an excellent opportunity to network with top professionals and learn more about the exciting research in Rosaceae genomics, genetics and breeding, all in a beautiful setting. The goal of this opportunity is to strengthen the U.S. Rosaceous workforce by enabling early-career scientists to establish collaborations within the Rosaceae community.

Early career scientists who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and non-citizens currently working at U.S. based institutions (in that order of priority), are eligible for this opportunity. Professionals from minority groups or from universities/organizations serving underrepresented groups are encouraged to apply.

The US Rosaceae Genomics, Genetics and Breeding Executive Committee (RosEXEC) will evaluate applications and select up to 4 awardees. Submit your application to: Dr. Per McCord (phmccord@wsu.edu) and Dr. Ksenija Gasic (kgasic@clemson.edu). Your application should include:
